1,000 and counting! Marnie Armstrong keeps on teaching

With the return of school we thought it would be timely to check in with one of Blueridge's long-time teachers....Meet Marnie Armstrong!

I sat down with Marnie on a bright sunny day (before the Labour Day weekend) to talk about her long history of teaching. We met at Blueridge Elementary, where she taught for many years. A long-time Blueridge resident and well-known to many,

Marnie estimates she has taught around 1,000 primary students in our community since starting her teaching career in 1979 at Blueridge Elementary. Many of us have had our kids taught by Marnie. My son Max, included. She talked about her love of teaching, inspired by her own grade three Seymour Heights teacher, Miss Kivist. "She inspired me," said Marnie. "I have always loved teaching K-3 students," she said. Marnie attended Seymour Heights Elementary, and then high school at Windsor Secondary. She earned her teacher's certificate from SFU. Shortly after, she was recruited to teach at Blueridge and, except for a spell at Lonsdale and Dorothy Lynas, taught at Blueridge from 1979 to 1985 and again from 1996 to 2016, when she retired. Even now when she is substitute teaching, she loves to fill in at Blueridge. "I love subbing. I miss the kids," she said. "Blueridge has my heart." "Meeting former students is like coming full circle," she said. "Blueridge teachers were nothing but dedicated; but it wasn't just us, the whole community shaped the kids." How are you greeted by former students, I asked? "Hello, Mrs Armstrong," was the answer, as if I didn't expect that. "The school has a stellar reputation around the district," she said. When she was young and growing up near Blueridge School, Marnie talked about "simpler" times. "We used to play in the bush, and collect tadpoles and frogs," she said. "I remember we all went to see a bear that had been shot and it looked sooo big."

Were you a good student? I asked, somewhat cheekily. "I was a good student, although I slipped a bit in grade 10—don't we all? I recovered though, and got an academic achievement award in grade 12!" Marnie and husband Barry along with sons Brett and Sean made their home on Sechelt Drive in 1989. Please join all of us to thank Marnie and all the teachers (and staff) who have dedicated their careers to teaching at Blueridge Elementary!

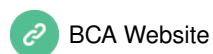
