This was interesting in itself because we still don't know some of our other neighbours.

We had assumed he is a nice and polite neighbour, which is a blessing for anyone, but Justin went beyond that. Every time he would see us working on something, he would come and ask if we needed help. This includes gardening, moving things around, and fixing things. He regularly mows our lawn without us asking him to do so. He has taken away our tree branches, makes sure the compost and garbage bins are in and out, and many other things. His family has also been very kind and helpful. His wife and children have been great. It makes me happy to see such good people living together as a family.

I feel very lucky to have a neighbour who helps us without even asking for his help. I know that there are many good people around us, but I think Justin should get recognition for all his kindness and goodness. Tortilla Soup

3 tablespoons olive oil

4 small corn tortillas, cut into 1-inch squares

1 1/2 tablespoons minced garlic
2 tablespoons minced onion
1 1/2 teaspoons minced jalapeno pepper
2 cups corn kernels (frozen and thawed is fine)
1 can chopped ripe tomatoes
1/3 cup tomato paste
2 1/2 teaspoons ground cumin
1/8 teaspoon ground pepper
1/2 teaspoon chili powder
1 1/2 cups water
1 quart chicken stock (or vegetable stock)

Garnishes

24 blue corn tortilla chips
2 cups shredded Cheddar cheese
1/2 cup chopped fresh cilantro

Over medium-high heat, fry tortilla squares in olive oil until they begin to crisp and turn a golden yellow. Add garlic, onion and jalapeno; cook 1 to 2 minutes, until onion becomes translucent. Add half the corn along with all other ingredients (except garnishes), reserving other half of corn to be added at the end. Bring the soup to a low, even simmer. Simmer for 5 minutes.

Remove soup from heat. Use a blender to puree. Return the soup to the burner and add the reserved corn. Bring the soup to a boil once again being extremely careful to avoid scorching or burning the soup.

To serve, garnish with blue corn tortilla chips, cilantro and sharp Cheddar cheese.

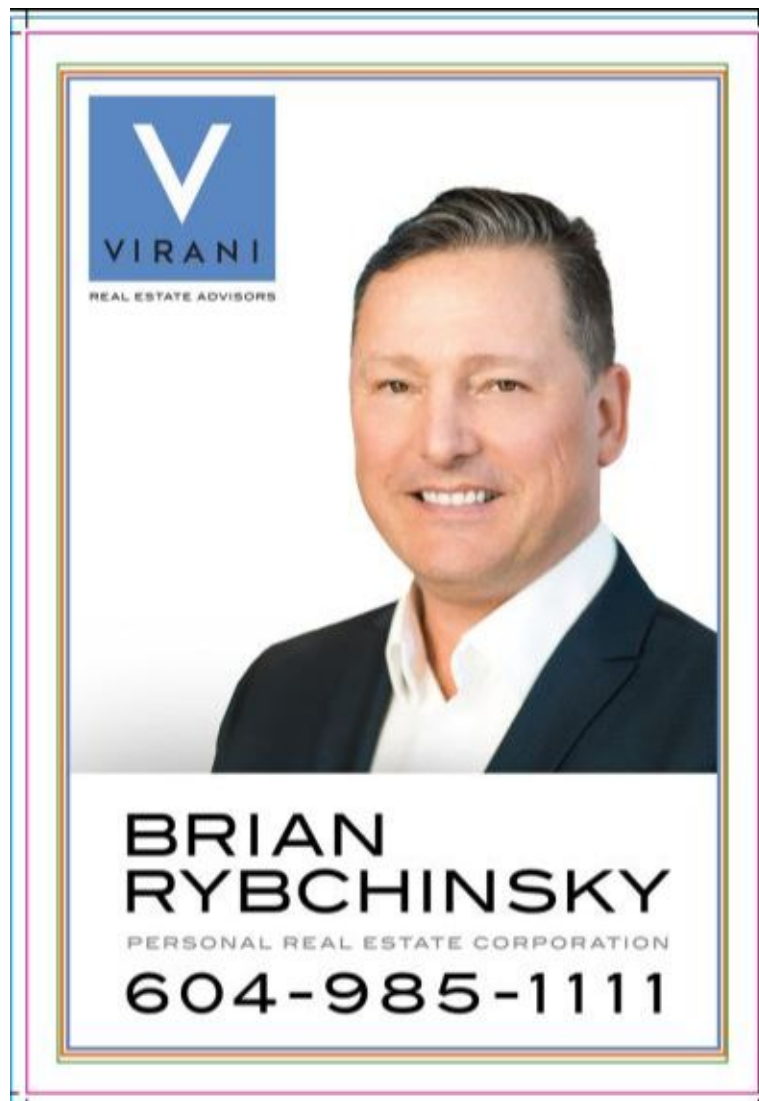
