About Chemtrade

Chemtrade's North Vancouver chlor-alkali facility is one of Canada's largest providers of liquid chlorine – accounting for 40 per cent of all liquid chlorine available in Canada. Regionally, this equates to over 70 per cent of the liquid chlorine available in BC and Alberta. **Why is this important?** A study conducted by [Statistics Canada in 2015](#) found that 96 per cent of Canadian communities relied on chlorine to treat their municipal water supply, which supplies over 30.7 million Canadians.

District of North Vancouver Rezoning Application Update

On September 25, we submitted our full rezoning application, to request that the production of liquid chlorine be listed as an allowable activity on our property (100 Amherst Avenue, North Vancouver). We are taking this step so that we can apply for development permits from the District for our planned safety improvement projects, which will substantially reduce potential risk for the community – see below enhanced photo which depicts the planned railcar loading enclosure, condenser tower, and tank farm for the air scrubbing equipment.

What now?

The District of North Vancouver has a formal process for the rezoning process, which includes several opportunities for the public to engage.

As part of the process, we will be hosting two Public Information Meeting (PIM) opportunities in the coming weeks, and then following that, there will be a Public Hearing (date to be confirmed).



Virtual Public Information Meeting (PIM)

A two-week public input opportunity will be held through the District of North Vancouver's platform. This is an opportunity for neighbours to share their feedback and ask questions to Chemtrade regarding its rezoning application for their chlor-alkali facility located at 100 Amherst Avenue, North Vancouver. **The virtual PIM will run from Monday, October 27 through to Friday, November 7, 2025, and be available at www.DNV.org/public-meeting**

In-Person Public Information Meeting (PIM)

Chemtrade will be hosting an in-person PIM on **Wednesday, October 29, 2025, from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m. at the Holiday Inn and Suites, North Vancouver**, located at 700 Old Lillooet Rd, North Vancouver, BC.

The meeting will be an open house format with information stations and staff available for questions from 6:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m., and a formal presentation and questions from the audience from 7:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m.

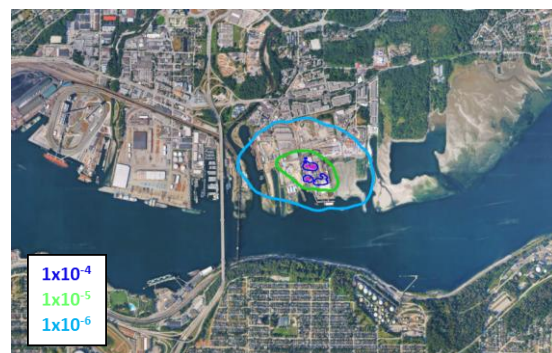
